# Medical students held a congress of neurology and neuroscience

## For the first time in Lleida has gathered more than a hundred people

Parkinson's, Alzheimer's, multiple sclerosis or autoimmune encephalitis are among the diseases discussed in Congress Interdisciplinary Student Neurology and Neuroscience which was held this weekend at the Auditorium on campus Cappont.

Organized by students of the Faculty of Medicine of the University of Lleida was the first time held in Lleida, and had the support of the Catalan Society of Neurology, the Spanish Society of Neuroscience, University, IRB and Medical Association of Lleida.



The sessions, which brought together more than 120 undergraduate students, masters and doctoral Medicine Catalan universities and the rest of the state, were run by professionals like Javier Pagonabarraga, a neurologist at the Movement Disorders Unit the Neurology service of hospital de Sant Pau in Barcelona, Mara Dierssen the Center for Genomic Regulation in Barcelona, and Josep Dalmau, from the Center for Biomedical Research August Pi i Sunyer in Barcelona.

During the congress, which ended with a presentation on the physiology of fondling also were awarded prizes for the best oral and poster were to Oriol Narcís (University of Cantabria) and Guillermo Aparicio (Institut Cajal, Madrid).

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
